## **HISTORICAL FACTSHEET No 1**

## Sir Robert Jones: a Brief Biography

1857	Born on 28 June in Rhyl, North Wales
1873	Commences medical training at the Liverpool School of Medicine
1878	Qualifies as a doctor and becomes professional assistant to his aunt's husband Hugh Owen Thomas, renowned Liverpool bonesetter
1887	Appointed Honorary Assistant Surgeon to the Stanley Hospital, Liverpool
1888	Appointed Surgeon-Superintendent of the Manchester Ship Canal
1889	Awarded Fellowship of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh
1889	Appointed Honorary Surgeon and Dean of the Clinical School, Royal Southern Hospital, Liverpool
1903	First meeting with Agnes Hunt when she consults RJ about her hip condition
1904	Becomes Honorary Surgeon to Agnes Hunt's Baschurch Home
1916	Appointed Inspector of Military Orthopaedics
1917	Receives a Knighthood
1921	The Baschurch Home moves to Oswestry and becomes the Shropshire Orthopaedic Hospital. RJ continues as Honorary Surgeon
1933	Dies on 14 January 1933 at the age of 75
1933	The Shropshire Orthopaedic Hospital is renamed the Robert Jones and Agnes Hunt Orthopaedic Hospital
